


Shop Report


Murray & Marilyn


Isometric **PYROPE** Garnet Mg3Al2(SiO4)3




Isometric **ALMANDINE** Fe₃Al₂(SiO₄)₃

Gravel from front door to the lapidary shop.




We did more grading in the back of the clubhouse before spreading the gravel.
